Students who would like to earn their GED diploma may take any of the programs above as part of Accelerating Opportunity: Kansas (AO-K). The program allows individuals to work toward their GED while receiving technical training. Tuition costs are covered by the Kansas Board of Regents. The student only pays a \$30 materials fee and the cost of taking four tests to earn the GED.
